

## Great Valley Rally

The Great Valley Rally is a treasure hunt designed for families with children aged 5 – 12 years. The Rally begins at the Swan Valley Visitor Centre and takes around three hours to complete.

Rally goers must solve cryptic clues to navigate themselves around the many attractions of the Swan Valley. At the finish line, families are presented with certificates and children receive small prizes as mementos of the experience. ## Swan Valley Heritage Cycling Trail

The Swan Valley's heritage cycle trail now has interpretive signage to complement the cycling routes which run through many of the valley's attractions. ## WA Reptile Park

The WA Reptile Park located in Henley Brook is home to some of the great Aussie reptiles including fresh water crocodiles and the amazing South American Boa Constrictor. The Maze family fun park is located just 45 minutes north of Perth in Bullsbrook, where you can explore 32 acres of lush parkland and enjoy a unique range of activities and mazes guaranteed to challenge and entertain the whole family. The main attraction is the 2500m<sup>2</sup> timber maze with lookout tower and supa slide but there's also 5 other mazes, mini golf, disc golf and friendly koalas, kangaroos and emus to meet. ## Caversham Wildlife Park

Situated in Whiteman Park, Caversham Wildlife Park houses one the largest collections of native fauna in Australia. It is also one of the only places in Western Australia where you will see species such as Cassowary, Flying Foxes, Quoll, etc. Take pictures with the Koalas, feed the Kangaroos, see the 'Farm Show'—sheep shearing, whip cracking, cow milking, etc. 'Meet the Wombat and Friends'—a collection of native fauna to interact with—or have a Camel Ride.
