Electric barbecues are free to use and can be used any time throughout the year. The use of wood-fired barbecues is subject to prevailing fire conditions during the prohibited burning season, from December to March. Please check with the City's Community Rangers on 9267 9326 for the most up to date fire weather conditions information before using these barbecues. Please note that firewood is not provided for wood fired-barbecues.

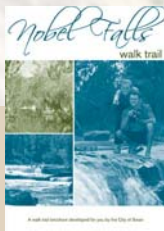

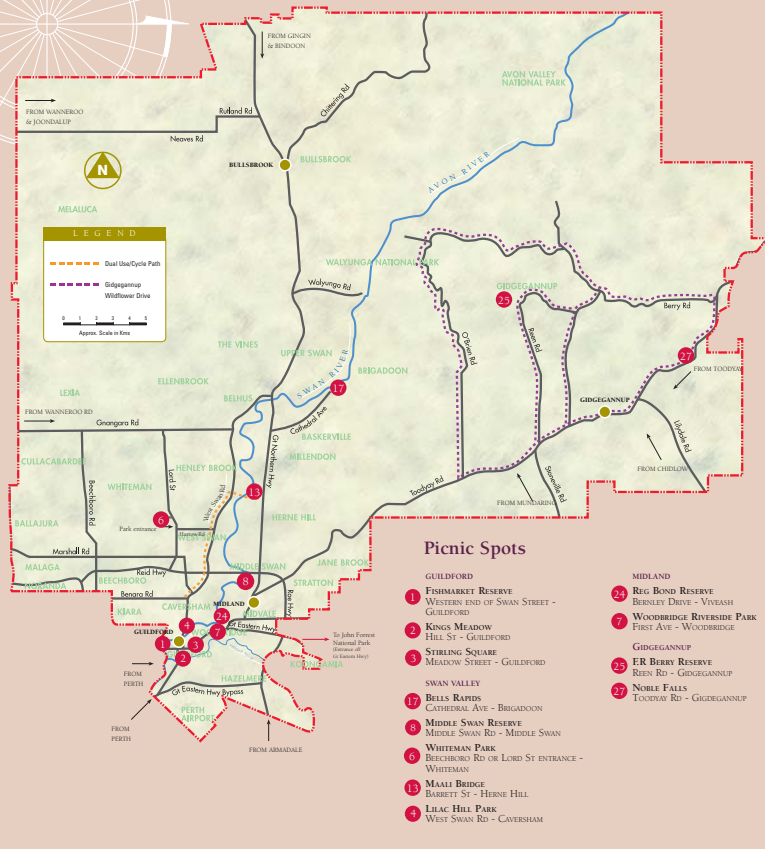
